Our New Proposed Bylaws: 2025 Timetable for Adoption

As Prairie Dulcimer Club takes steps to become an officially approved 501(c)3 non-profit corporation, we are beginning the ratification process for an updated version of the PDC Bylaws. This process will occur in three stages at our regular monthly business meetings, beginning this month:

- Stage 1: April 19: Introduction to the Proposed Bylaws; Q& A and discussion
- Stage 2: May 17: Additional Discussion; Preliminary Vote by the Membership to adopt the Bylaws document
- Stage 3: June 21: Additional Discussion: Final Vote by the Membership to adopt the Bylaws document

Ahead of our April 19th business meeting, all up-to-date PDC members will receive an electronic copy of the newly proposed PDC Bylaws. Then at the April 19 business meeting, we will briefly explain and then take comments and questions. But no action will be taken this month.

PLEASE NOTE: Only current PDC members are allowed to vote in the Bylaw approval process. We want you to be included in this important process, so please be sure that your 2025 membership dues have been paid to Treasurer Ken Werne.

MINUTES FROM OUR LAST BUSINESS MEETING: February 15, 2025

Treasurer:

Treasurer Ken Werne gave the treasurer's report with a total balance of \$5,847.28. Annual memberships are due now for 2025 - individual is \$25 and family is \$40.

Updates and New Business:

Thank you to all the performers for the great turn out at the Chocolate Festival. Special thanks to Barry for playing backup on the guitar.

We have the opportunity to play at all of Missouri Town 1855 festivals in 2025: May 3 - Sheep Shindig; 4th of July; October 4 & 5 -Fall Festival; December 6 - Christmas Celebration.

Several members gave reports on the latest Quarantune classes.

Linda Thomas spoke about the upcoming workshop on March 15 and thanked the club for the support. Duane Porterfield will be teaching the mountain dulcimers. The cost of the workshop is \$50 for club members and \$75 for non-members. The club reimburses the workshop teachers \$25 per club member in attendance. Club members need to let Ken Werne know if they will be attending the March workshop.

Linda will also be teaching a workshop at the Ozark Roots Festival, July 10-12 in Mountain View, Arkansas.

President Ken submitted the revised by-laws to the Executive Committee for review.

Make plans to attend the June 3 workshop with area music educators to demonstrate using dulcimers to teach music. The location and time is to be determined.
