## **Our New Proposed Bylaws: 2025 Timetable for Adoption**

As Prairie Dulcimer Club takes steps to become an officially approved 501(c)3 non-profit corporation, we are beginning the ratification process for an updated version of the PDC Bylaws. This process will occur in three stages at our regular monthly business meetings:

- Stage 1: April 19: Introduction to the Proposed Bylaws; Q& A and discussion
- Stage 2: May 17: Additional Discussion; Preliminary Vote by the Membership to adopt the Bylaws document
- Stage 3: June 21: Additional Discussion: Final Vote by the Membership to adopt the Bylaws document

**PLEASE NOTE:** Only current PDC members are allowed to vote in the Bylaw approval process. We want you to be included in this important process, so please be sure that your 2025 membership dues have been paid to Treasurer Ken Werne.

**ELECTING A VICE-PRESIDENT THIS MONTH.** In accordance with our new Bylaws to be ratified this month, we will be electing a Vice-President for the Executive Committee at the June Business Meeting. Easel Roberts has agreed to let his name stand for this office. #### MINUTES FROM OUR LAST BUSINESS MEETING: MAY 17th 2025

President Ken Shoemaker called the meeting to order at 10:30 AM. Ramona Crawford was recognized for her birthday in May. Kathy Stone, who has joined the beginner Mountain Dulcimer class, was welcomed as a first-time guest.

#### **Treasurer's Report:**

Treasurer Ken Werne provided the treasurer \$\#39\$; report:

- opening balance -\$5,499.66 income-\$250 from memberships expense -\$27 website hosting
- ending balance -\$5,722.26 with \$466.15 in reserve for the mentoring program and \$6,8841 available in unrestricted funds.

## **Minutes from Last Meeting:**

Sandy McKay read the minutes of the April 19, 2025 business meeting. Mary Richardson moved to approve them as read. David Courtney seconded and the minutes were approved.

## New Business:

#### 1. By-laws

Ken Shoemaker reviewed the By-law approval process. He asked for preliminary approval of the By-laws revised to reflect member comments gathered at the April 19 meeting. They were emailed to members for review prior to today's meeting. Dave Courtney moved to approve the revised By-laws and Ellen Marquart seconded. The revised Bylaws were approved. Final approval of the By-laws will occur at the June meeting.

## 2. Nomination for the new Vice President position.

The new By-laws call for the position of Vice President. Ken Shoemaker announced that Easel Roberts has indicated he would be willing to accept the position. Ken encouraged anyone interested in the role to contact him. Members interested in nominating someone other than themselves must secure acceptance from that individual prior to nominating them. An election will be held at the June meeting.

#### 3. Purchase of business cards

Ken requested approval for \$100 to purchase business cards for the purpose of promoting the organization. He distributed a draft which includes depiction of dulcimer instruments and the website. Congratulations were offered to Easel for the featured QR code to facilitate navigation to the website. Sheryl Godsey moved to approve the allocation of \$100 and Rita Young seconded. Approval was unanimous.

#### 4. Securing Timothy Seaman for the July club meeting

Ken Shoemaker requested \$300 for Timothy Seaman to conduct a workshop (both mountain and hammer dulcimer instruction) followed by a concert. Easel Roberts moved to approve and David Tate seconded. The request for \$300 was approved. Ken offered the idea of securing event space and promoting an evening concert featuring Timothy where admission will be charged. He encouraged members to contact him with event space suggestions as soon as possible.
