**Business Meeting:** The meeting was called to order by President Otis Watson. He welcomed visitors Debbie Thornton and Mike Manaday, both hammered dulcimer players. Katy Waters made a motion to accept the minutes from the last meeting as printed in the newsletter. Penny Lewis seconded, motion approved.

Treasurer's Report – Treasurer, Mary Richardson presented the treasurer's report. Rusty Denes made a motion to accept the report. Motion seconded by Rita Young, approved.

New Business – A proposal was made to change the format of our meetings starting in January. Two formats were suggested. One is to have everyone jam together from 9:00-10:15, and then break for the business meeting. Afterward, we would break into classes and have a workshop time until lunch time. The other suggestion was to switch the jam time and workshop time (i.e. workshop first, jam after the business meeting). It was also suggested that we have a list of 9 songs for 2019 that everyone would focus on and try to learn to play without music. These are the songs we would jam on during this early jam session. The after lunch jam session would continue as it has been, jamming on club music and songs that everyone likes. Much discussion was held. Pros and cons for both formats were presented. It was also suggested that we continue to have people available to help beginners.

Allan Macfarlane commented that we need songs that have some advanced and new chords. We would put the music on our club website. We should learn songs outside of the key of D to expand our horizons.

A committee was elected to explore the options, coming up with a list of songs and to bring a proposal to the November meeting. Committee members are Allan Macfarlane, Kim Morrow, Lee Ann Gooze and Rita Young. Everyone was asked to submit song suggestions via email to one of the committee members no later than October 31<sup>st</sup>.

Rita Young reminded everyone that they should watch for an email if the weather is bad. Dana Taylor will contact Rita if the weather is too bad and the meeting is cancelled. Rita will send out a quick email to everyone.

Lin Everett liked the call chain and email when Mo. Town was cancelled.

Discussion was also had about bringing instructors to our meetings. Dave Courtney suggested Aaron Rogers. Kim Morrow suggested that we could raise the dues to have money to pay instructors to come or have guests pay to attend.

Old Business – Pam Haskell gave a report on Mo. Town. Because they set up the tent and the club was going to make an effort to perform, the club will still receive the \$250.00 agreed on. Special thanks again to Pam and team for all their hard work to put this event together.

Education Committee Report – Katy Waters introduced her student, Brenna Kuder, whom she is mentoring on hammered dulcimer. Katy made a motion that Rita Young take over Brenna's mentoring when Katy leaves town. Ted seconded, motion approved.

Dana Taylor made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Seconded by Rita Young, motion approved, meeting adjourned.
